Dear fellow servants of Christ Jesus.

My heart is so full of thanksgiving towards God for His bountiful supply at the camp through His faithful servants. This year has been one of tremendous blessing and provision for camp needs. Ever since the Lord first gave me the vision for the camp I have had a vision of what the camp would become. That vision is slowly becoming a reality through the Lord's miraculous provision. Although it has been a tremendous amount of physical work on our part, the unmistakable hand of God working throughout the whole process to make it come into being has been humbling. There is still a long ways to go but I have the assurance that the Lord is faithful to complete all that it is in His will to do.

One of the biggest praises for me personally is that my family has been living at the camp with me for the last two and a half months because of the Lord's provision of a a home for them at the camp. Having Irene with me full time at the camp has been a tremendous relief as she is such a powerful minister herself and helper to me. Benjamin is also doing great as a home-schooler, which is a big answer to prayer. We are using the Accelerated Christian Education curriculum for him and he is loving it. Ministry at the camp this summer has not been at all what I had expected it to be.
